#### Professor Brent Lovelock, University of Otago, New Zealand

Brent is a Professor of Tourism at the University of Otago School of Business (Dunedin, New Zealand), where his research focuses on sustainable and regenerative tourism.

Before becoming an academic Brent lived and worked in 'real world' nature-based destinations, so is aware of the challenges of managing tourism for the benefit of visitors and host community members alike - while also respecting the natural and cultural values of places.

He has undertaken consultancy projects for communities, government and NGOs on visitor experiences in national parks and natural areas, on the economic benefits of nature-based tourism and on community-based tourism. As a side project he has published a book on the ethics of tourism and has worked on medical and dental tourism. He teaches mainly in the area of destination management.

Brent is passionate about enhancing human connections with nature and will be joining the forum after a two-week stint as a 'Conversationalist' on a cruise ship exploring the islands and fiords of New Zealand.



#### Craig "Hassie" Haslam, Owner, Untamed Escapes

Craig "Hassie" Haslam has owned many hospitality and tourism businesses over the past three decades and is best known as the owner of Untamed Escapes, which operates small group and private tours throughout South Australia, Western Australia and the Red Centre. Untamed Escapes connects travellers from all walks of life with adventure, culture, wildlife, wellness, and epicurean experiences in nature. #### Professor Kirsten Holmes - School of Management and Marketing, Curtin University and Co-Director Curtin's Tourism Research Cluster

Professor Kirsten Holmes is the Co-Director of Curtin's Tourism Research Cluster. She is past Chair and a Fellow of the Council for Australasian Tourism and Hospitality Education (CAUTHE) and has taught tourism and events management in Australia and the UK. She has been researching volunteering and volunteer tourism for 30 years and recently stepped down as the Co-Chair of Volunteering Australia's National Volunteering Research Network as well as Volunteering WA's Research Committee.

She has completed research for the Australian and UK Governments, the International Olympic Committee, and the National Trust for England and Wales and is currently working with Volunteering Australia and several state peak bodies to develop a national roadmap for volunteering in rural Australia to support the National Volunteering Strategy.

The Experiences part of the business has steadily grown as customers seek more knowledge about Aboriginal culture and life.




