## The Hon Alannah MacTiernan BA LLB BJuris JP MLC, Minister for Regional Development; Agriculture and Food; Hydrogen Energy

As Minister for Planning and Infrastructure from 2001 to 2008, Ms MacTiernan was responsible for major projects across the State including the Mandurah rail line, the Forrest Highway, the Geraldton port and rail expansion and the Armadale town centre and Champion Lakes developments. In 2011 she was elected Mayor of the City of Vincent and in 2013 was elected as the Member for Perth to the Federal Parliament. After Ms MacTiernan decided not to recontest Perth in 2016, she was invited to re-join WA Labor in the Legislative Council. After being elected in 2017, she was appointed Minister for Regional Development, Agriculture and Food and Minister Assisting the Minister for State Development, Jobs and Trade. The Minister is committed to creating economic opportunity in our regional areas as well as bringing WA's agricultural sector into the 21st century through innovation and a focus on investing in science.



#### The Hon William Hodgman, Australian High Commissioner to Singapore

William Hodgman was announced as Australia's High Commissioner to Singapore in November 2021. Prior to that Mr Hodgman was the Inaugural Chair of Australia's Business Growth Fund. He served in the Parliament of Tasmania from 2002 to 2020, including as the State's 45th Premier from 2014 to 2020. As Premier, Mr Hodgman initiated trade missions to the Indo-Pacific and Europe to promote economic, cultural and social links to Tasmania. He held several Ministerial positions in the Tasmanian Parliament, including Attorney-General, Minister for Justice, Tourism, Hospitality and Events, Trade, Prevention of Family Violence, Advanced Manufacturing and Defence Industries, Parks, Heritage, Sport and Recreation, the Arts and Aboriginal Affairs, and Leader of the Opposition. He practiced law in various roles before entering Parliament.
